RULES AND REGULATIONS G. A. R.

ARTICLE IV.—CHAPTER I.

Eligibility to Membership.—Soldiers and sailors of the United States Army, Navy or Marine Corps, who served between April 12th, 1861, and April 9th, 1865, in the war for the suppression of the Rebellion, and those having been honorably discharged therefrom after such service, and of such State regiments as were called into active service and subject to the orders of U. S. General Officers, between the dates mentioned, shall be eligible to membership in the Grand Army of the Republic. No person shall be eligible to membership who has at any time borne arms against the United States.

I have the honor to make application for membership in Sam Grinnell Post No. 283 Department of Mich Grand Army of the Republic, basing my application on the following facts:

I am ⁵⁴~~53~~ years of age, and was born in Seneca Co State of Ohio, now residing at Sunfield Eaton Co State of Mich, am by occupation a Farmer.

I served during the late rebellion as follows:

First enlisted Oct First 1861, as Corporal in Co. B 57 Regiment Ohio for the period of 3 years, and was discharged therefrom as Corporal, at Columbus Ohio on the 30 day of July 1862, by reason of Sergents Certificate
