RULES AND REGULATIONS, G. A. R.

ARTICLE IV.—CHAPTER I.

ELIGIBILITY TO MEMBERSHIP—Soldiers and Sailors of the United States Army, Navy or Marine Corps, who served between April 12th, 1861, and April 9th, 1865, in the war for the suppression of the Rebellion, and those having been honorably discharged therefrom after such service, and of such State regiments as were called into active service and subject to the orders of U. S. General Officers, between the dates mentioned, shall be eligible to membership in the Grand Army of the Republic. No person shall be eligible to membership, who has, at any time, borne arms against the United States.

I have the honor to make application for membership in San Ginnell
Post, No. 283 Department of Mich Grand Army of the Republic,
basing my application on the following facts:

I am 74 years of age, and was born in NY State
of NY, now residing at Sunfield
State of Mich, and by occupation a Farmer.

I served during the late Rebellion as follows:

First enlisted Novemb 5 1861, as a private in Co. G
27 Regiment NY for the period of 2 years, and
was discharged therefrom as corp, at Albion NY
on the 25 day of May 1862, by reason of Expiration
of Time.

I also re-enlisted 186, as in Co.
Regiment and was discharged therefrom as

I have never borne arms against the United States, and have never been convicted of Desertion, nor of any other infamous crime.

I have not made previous application for membership to the Grand Army of the Republic and filed the same with W Bennell Post, No. 283 Department of Mich on the 18 day of May 1911
